

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION FIVE OF ORDINANCE NO. 2830, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE ZONIFICATION ORDINANCE, AS LASTLY AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 3039, REFERRING TO BUSINESS IN COMMERCIAL ZONES BY REDUCING THE DISTANCE OF THE LOCATION OF ONE GASOLINE SERVICE STATION TO ANOTHER FROM 250 METERS TO 100 METERS.

Be it ordained by the Municipal Board of the City of Manila, that:

SECTION 1. Section 5 of Ordinance No. 2830, otherwise known as the Zonification Ordinance, as lastly amended by Ordinance No. 3039, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 5. BUSINESS IN COMMERCIAL ZONES.- The following businesses, buildings, and establishments shall be restricted to commercial zones, namely: markets, bakeries, dry goods and grocery stores, office buildings, electric sub-stations, garage and gasoline service stations, light industries clearly incidental to a retail business house with machinery not exceeding 5 horsepower, funeral parlors, bazaars, or tiendas, bill-boards, printing shops, and newspaper publishing, cosmetic factories and bowling alleys. Cold Storage, hat factories, and watch repairing shops may also be established in these zones.

Notwithstanding existing Ordinances to the contrary, the distance from one gasoline service station to another in the zones where such stations are permitted to be established, shall not be less than one hundred meters.


No light or mixed material structures of permanent or semi-permanent character shall be permitted in these zones."


SEC. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.


