AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE AMOUNT OF P4,306,360.00 TO BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR THE PURCHASE OF ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT AND FOR THE OPERATIONAL EXPENSES OF ARSENIO H. LACSON MEMORIAL HOSPITAL, UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

Be it ordained by the Municipal Board of the City of Manila, that:

SECTION 1. The amount of P4,306,360.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the unappropriated fund existing in the City Treasury to be made available for the purchase of additional equipment and for the operational expenses of Arsenio H. Lacson Memorial Hospital.

SEC. 2. Any disbursement of the amount appropriated in Section 1 hereof shall be through a resolution of the Municipal Board approved by the Mayor: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That the purchase of the equipment shall be undertaken through a public bidding and shall be held only upon prior and proper certification by the City Treasurer as to the availability of funds; that all disbursements of the amount herein appropriated shall be in accordance with all legal and auditing requirements; that any excess in the amount herein appropriated shall, upon payment of the purchased equipment, revert to the general fund; and that the Mayor shall submit to the Offices of the Municipal Board and of the Vice-Mayor and Presiding Officer of said Body a report on the implementation of this measure not later than April 30, 1968.

SEC. 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.

Originally enacted by the Municipal Board of the City of Manila on November 24, 1967, and modified today, December 21, 1967.
