AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE NO. 3820, RELATIVE TO THE PROHIBITION AGAINST THE CARRYING BY ANY PERSON OF ANY KIND OF BOWIE KNIFE, HUNTING KNIFE, DIRK, DAGGER, KRIS, OR OTHER DEADLY WEAPON ABOUT HIS PERSON IN CERTAIN PLACES, BY EXEMPTING CERTAIN PERSONS FROM THE PROVISION OF SAID ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Municipal Board of the City of Manila, that:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of Ordinance No. 3820 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to carry concealed in his person in any manner that would disguise its deadly character, any kind of bowie knife, hunting knife, dirk, dagger, kris, or other deadly weapon in and within any government building, office or premises; whether belonging to the national or local government, school, church, hospital, dispensary, public clinic, public market, street, public parks and plaza, private office and building, theatre, cinematograph, Jai-Alai, restaurant, refreshment place, cafe, bar, public billiard and pool halls, public conveyance, public pooling tables, bowling alleys, racetracks, cockpit, stadium and other similar establishments or places used for other public exhibitions and athletic contests or where public meetings or gatherings are held, or in any public place in the City: PROVIDED, That when there is any person in any of the premises herein mentioned duly designated to accept and actually charged with the duty of accepting deposits of deadly weapons herein mentioned, it shall be unlawful for any possessor thereof not to deposit such weapon with said person, except when the possessor is a regular peace officer of the national or city government or employee of the owners or persons in charge of any private premises above referred to who are specifically assigned or designated to guard and preserve peace and order in the premises concerned: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That any person convicted of any grave or less grave felony or of any light felony wherein the accused was charged with having used a weapon similar to those herein mentioned in the commission of the offense is hereby prohibited to carry any of the weapons herein enumerated anywhere at anytime, whether the conviction be final, pending appeal or reconsideration."
