ORDINANCE NO. AN ORDINANCE RENAMING TENNESSEE STREET IN MALATE "GENERAL MIGUEL MALVAR STREET." WHEREAS, General Miguel Malvar, the last Filipino general to surrender to the American forces during the Filipino-American War, is considered by many historians as the second president of the Revolutionary Republic, having assumed the said position in an acting capacity after General Emilio Aguinaldo was captured by the Americans: WHEREAS, General Miguel Malvar spent the remaining years of his life in the City of Manila, particularly near Tennessee Street; after declining an offer to serve as Governor of Batangas following his surrender on April 16, 1902; WHEREAS, the naming of a public street in honor of the memory of General Miguel Malvar who, in the words of the late General Emilio Aguinaldo, was the bravest general of the revolution, will serve as a fitting memorial to his bravery and patriotism: Now, therefore Be it ordained by the Municipal Board of the City of Manila, that: SECTION 1. Tennessee Street in Malate is hereby renamed "General Miguel Malvar Street." SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.
